The Figge Art Museum in April will open a gallery of works on loan from Deere & Company's corporate art collection. These will be on view for the general public for the first time. The gallery will debut on the fourth floor of the museum on April 24 with an exhibition of works by Grant Wood, Edward Curtis, Joan Miro, Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec, Rufino Tamayo, Sofu Teshigahara, and Matazo Kayama. The exhibition will include Grant Wood's iconic *Fall Plowing*, as well as his *Fruits of Iowa* series.

Rock Island Police Chief John Wright has announced that he will retire effective January 29. Wright, a Rock Island native, has been with the Rock Island Police Department for more than 30 years and has served as chief since 2005. Rock Island City Manager John Phillips said that he would start the recruitment process immediately and plans a nationwide search for Wright's successor. Phillips said that he hopes to have the next chief appointed by June.

Senator Chuck Grassley of Iowa was listed as one of 100 individuals who this year "impacted the world of business ethics in ways that will continue to resonate for many years." The Ethisphere Institute describes itself as "a leading international think tank dedicated to the creation, advancement, and sharing of best practices in business ethics, corporate social responsibility, anti-corruption, and sustainability." Its citation reads: "Grassley's is a leading voice in the Senate speaking out against corruption and financial fraud. Even before the financial crisis of last year, Grassley's name always seemed to come up in financial-fraud stories. He is aware of what's going on and is aggressively going after those that commit fraud." Grassley is ranking member and former chair of the Committee on Finance. St. Ambrose University will receive \$600,000 for facilities and equipment, and Palmer College will receive \$400,000 to expand a model integrative-health-care program for the treatment of pain as part of the federal Fiscal Year 2010 Labor, Health, & Human Services appropriations bill. The legislation was signed into law on December 16.
