

## Schilling Seeks Affordable and Accessible Health Care

Washington, DC – Congressman Bobby Schilling (IL-17) today released the following statement after the Supreme Court decision on the health care reform law's constitutionality.

"The wait on the health care reform law's constitutionality is over, but the uncertainty remains for folks who need health care. My goal is to make health care affordable and accessible, and this law just doesn't do the trick. I will continue to work to ensure that health care is affordable and accessible for all Americans.

Believing it is important for Members of Congress to lead by example, Schilling rejected the Congressional Budget Office's recommendation to continue the law's future. Schilling spoke on the floor of the House of Representatives in support of H.R. 6079, which passed the House of Representatives.

Mr. Speaker, like many in Illinois' 17th District, I'm disappointed that the Supreme Court decided to uphold the health care reform law.

The court ruled what we all knew from the beginning but the president wouldn't acknowledge -- the law is unconstitutional.

Under this law, health care costs remain too high.

Government bureaucrats remain between patients and their doctors.

Too many Americans remain unemployed, with national unemployment hovering above 8 percent for the past several months.

The law's medical device tax will continue to raise health care costs and limit the ability of facilities like hospitals to provide quality care.

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And the law's employer mandate will continue to force employers to choose between paying a penalty
