DISPATCHER: 9-1-1. What's the address of the emergency?

CALLER: It would be 1012 Marquette Street.

DISPATCHER: And what's the phone number you're calling from?

CALLER: 563-209-1803.

DISPATCHER: And your name?

CALLER: John Fahs.

DISPATCHER: And what's the problem, John?

CALLER: The neighbor – the neighbor's out here pointing a gun at us, so we feel it's time --

DISPATCHER: What's the neighbor's name?

CALLER: Keith Meyer.

DISPATCHER: Okay. All right. What's he wearing today?

CALLER: Pardon me?

DISPATCHER: What's he wearing today?

CALLER: He's wearing bib overalls, I believe.

DISPATCHER: Is he out front or out back?

CALLER: He's right -- right by our driveway and now I'm in the house, so I don't know if he's still standing there or not. I took a picture.

DISPATCHER: Okay. And Keith is at 1012 Marquette, or you are?

CALLER: He's at 1012. I'm next door at 1010 Marquette.

DISPATCHER: And was it a handgun or a long gun --

CALLER: Pardon me?

DISPATCHER: Was it a handgun or --

CALLER: A long-type rifle.

DISPATCHER: Did he say anything or anything?

CALLER: Oh, yeah, he's gonna shoot me 'cuz he doesn't like us using this driveway. It's a shared driveway. This is about the third or fourth time he's done it. Now this is the first time he's out there with a gun, so it's time -- time to do something with him.

DISPATCHER: Okay. You can't see him any longer?

CALLER: Pardon me?

DISPATCHER: You can't see him any longer?

CALLER: Stay any longer?

DISPATCHER: You can't see him anymore?

CALLER: Let me look out window here. Yeah, he's still out there. He's out there with the gun.

DISPATCHER: Okay. Okay. Okay. We have officers on the way. Nobody is hurt or anything, are they?

CALLER: He hasn't shot anybody yet, no.

DISPATCHER: How do you spell your last name, John?

CALLER: F-A-H-S.

DISPATCHER: Okay. Okay. Okay. We'll get somebody over there. If you can just stay in your house until we can get somebody there --

CALLER: Okay. I sure will.

DISPATCHER: Okay. All right. Thank you.

CALLER: Bye.

3 MR. MEYER: What is this? Yeah. What garage? What?

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: There is a white male and a black
5 male (inaudible).

6 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible).

7 MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: He said last time he saw him he
9 walked up to him. I suppose I'll go check the house. I
10 didn't get that -- so did you originally answer the phone the
11 first time he called or were you on another call?

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No, I was on another call.

13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay. All right.

14 (Inaudible).

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So explain to me what
17 happened.

18 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Well, I was just coming out to
19 get my newspaper, like I normally do, and by God, I come out
20 here, he just rants and raves, because he doesn't like having
21 to share a --

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No --

23 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: So there he is with his
24 goddamn -- he had it pointed at me before I could take the
25 picture. It was right around here, and I was walking down

1 the hill.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Oh, God.

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He's got a long shotgun; I don't
4 know if you can see it very good.

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You can see it.

8 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible) Davenport? Ball.

10 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: That's part of the
11 problem, he can't hear, either.

12 (Whistling.)

13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Keith.

14 (Knocking.)

15 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

16 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible). Do you have a
17 shotgun or a rifle.

18 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible). I just walked outside
19 (inaudible).

20 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Okay, where's your gun?

21 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible).

22 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Where's your gun?

23 MR. MEYER: It's a shotgun.

24 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Where is it?

25 MR. MEYER: It's inside. You don't have the right to

1 take it.

2 (Laughing.)

3 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Keith, you're gonna go to jail if
4 you don't knock it off.

5 MR. MEYER: Do something with him, okay?

6 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Keith.

7 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: You're the one that's
8 raising a shotgun at people.

9 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible).

10 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: You're not walking away
11 from us now until we're done talking to you.

12 MR. MEYER: I'm going to (inaudible). This guy's been
13 threatening me, run over my stuff, damaged my property. You
14 didn't come on my property, yeah, I know, that's okay. Fine.
15 You and me --

16 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Well, we're not leaving
17 here.

18 MR. MEYER: Jesus Christ.

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You can't point a gun at
20 somebody.

21 MR. MEYER: I didn't point a gun at him, I held it
22 across my chest.

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Why?

24 MR. MEYER: Because he was threatening me.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: How's he threatening you?

1 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible).

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: We'll do it a different way.
3 Come here. We've got a picture of him outside with the gun,
4 you want to just go get it?

5 MR. MEYER: A gun, really? A gun?

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Throw it in my --
7 (inaudible).

8 Keith, where's the gun at?

9 MR. MEYER: I'm through talking. It's in the house.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Where?

11 MR. MEYER: You don't go in my house.

12 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Where in the house?

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You don't run around on your
14 public property -- your property pointing guns at people.

15 MR. MEYER: I didn't point my gun.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Really? He has a picture of
17 you holding it.

18 MR. MEYER: He threatened me.

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Where?

20 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Okay, then you call us and
21 we deal with that. That doesn't give you the right to be
22 seen with a gun.

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Were you scared?

24 MR. MEYER: He was over destroying my property.

25 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: You talk to a --

1 (inaudible).

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: This is -- I mean.
3 I'll be up to talk to you in a second.

4 (Radio noise.)

5 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Driver's license
6 (inaudible).

7 MR. MEYER: What?

8 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: May I see your I.D.,
9 please?

10 MR. MEYER: My what?

11 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Your I.D.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: He's got a picture of him.

13 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Your license,
14 identification.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You've been here before,
16 right?

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Way too many times.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: This is just getting out of
19 hand.

20 (Overlapping, inaudible speakers.)

21 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible).

22 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Oh, yeah.

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Have you been in here? This
25 place is phenomenal. (Inaudible) his light. He's got

1 (inaudible) everywhere. Check it out.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Oh, my God. Inside.

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah. Check this room out.

4 Check this room out.

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, check this room out,
7 though. Tell me this ain't the coolest thing ever.

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Holy shit. The dude's got
9 everything.

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: This is pretty cool.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I don't know where his guns
12 are. He makes a ton of wine, though.

13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible). Well transfer --

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I thought he had it -- oh,
15 he moved his bed down here.

16 MR. MEYER: It's all on here.

17 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Okay. I'm having a hard
18 time reading the year.

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I'm guessing under the
20 stairs.

21 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: August 6th of what year,
22 please?

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: No.

24 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible).

25 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

1 MR. MEYER: They're locked in my car; can I let them
2 out?

3 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: In a minute. Can you tell
4 me your year of birth, please? '41?

5 MR. MEYER: Can I let my dogs out of the car; they're
6 locked in the car.

7 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Can you answer my
8 question?

9 MR. MEYER: I can't hear you.

10 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: What year were you born?

11 MR. MEYER: 41.

12 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Thank you.

13 What's your Social Security Number?

14 MR. MEYER: It's on there.

15 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: No, it's not.

16 MR. MEYER: 178-52-4835.

17 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: 178-52?

18 MR. MEYER: 4835.

19 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: What about a phone number?

20 MR. MEYER: 326-0469.

21 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: All right.

22 MR. MEYER: Can I let my dogs out of the car?

23 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: (Inaudible). 11:45, I'm
24 going to read your Miranda to you. You have the right to
25 remain silent. Anything you say can and will be used against

1 you in a court of law. You have the right to talk to a
2 lawyer (inaudible). If you cannot afford to hire a lawyer,
3 one will be appointed to represent you (inaudible) if you
4 decide at any time to exercise these rights and not answer
5 any questions or make any statements. Do you understand your
6 rights.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Holy Jesus.

8 MR. MEYER: Yes.

9 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Okay. Having been read
10 your rights, do you wish to talk to me about this?

11 MR. MEYER: Can I let my dogs out of the car?

12 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Do you want to talk to me
13 about this, or you don't want to talk to me?

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Holy shit.

15 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Your dog is staying in the
16 car for a minute.

17 (Inaudible, due to radio noise.)

18 MR. MEYER: No they're locked in the car.

19 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Okay. Well, they'll be
20 okay until we're done talking.

21 MR. MEYER: I want to let them out.

22 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: I read you your Miranda.
23 Do you want to speak with me?

24 MR. MEYER: I understand you read me my rights, okay?

25 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Okay. Do you want to

1 speak with me about this or --

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: That is a lot of alcohol.

3 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: -- or do you want to get a
4 lawyer?

5 MR. MEYER: I can't understand you.

6 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Do you want to speak with
7 me, or would you like to get a lawyer?

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

9 MR. MEYER: I want to see a lawyer.

10 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: You want to talk to your
11 lawyer? Okay.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

13 MR. MEYER: Can I get my dogs out of the car?

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Holy Jesus, dude.
15 (Inaudible). You have got to be kidding me with this. This
16 just keeps going, man. There's the (inaudible).

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I believe so. Oh, for the
19 love of God. I am completely amazed. I've never been down
20 here. (Inaudible).

21 MR. MEYER: Will you let my dogs out of the car? Will
22 you let my dogs out of the car? They're locked in the car.
23 Will you let my dogs out of the car?

24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible). These are all

1 fermented out. Those are done.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: It goes to --

4 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible).

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Technically, mine is.

7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay. Are you in here for a
8 reason?

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Because he pointed a shotgun
10 at the neighbor.

11 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: And (inaudible) at the neighbor.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yep.

13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: And the neighbor (inaudible) --
14 tell him what happened.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: He had an ongoing dispute
16 with the neighbor about sharing the driveway.

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Uh-huh.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: The neighbor was on his way
19 down to get the paper, and he screamed something at him and
20 pointed a shotgun at him.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: So he did --

22 MR. MEYER: Can you let my dogs out of the car?

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: That's what he said. And he
24 took a picture of him, because he's constantly (inaudible) up
25 to him, and there's a picture of Keith standing there in the

1 driveway holding a shotgun.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Holding the shotgun or
3 (inaudible) the shotgun.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: In the picture it looked
5 like he was just waiting for (inaudible).

6 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible) with a gun; Let my dogs out of
7 the car.

8 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: We have to get your gun
9 out before (inaudible) -- I can let you out so show me where
10 the gun is.

11 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: With a shotgun, just (inaudible).

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I would say (inaudible)
13 doing something.

14 MR. MEYER: No.

15 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: No what?

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: He's not up there screaming.

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: What is he saying? Has he been
18 Mirandized? He's saying the neighbor threatened him?

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You know how this goes, what
21 you've got to do (inaudible). We take Keith Meyers to jail,
22 we've got to prove we've got probable cause that he did
23 something other than standing in his driveway on his property
24 (inaudible).

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. The neighbor -- it's

1 not a private driveway, it's shared.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

3 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: He's Mirandized

4 (inaudible) keeps saying he wants his dogs out of the car. I
5 told him his dog doesn't get out of the car until (inaudible)
6 the gun. He said if you would let him let his dog out of the
7 car, he'll tell you where the gun is.

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So Joe doesn't think we have
9 anything.

10 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: Joe doesn't what?

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: He doesn't think we have
12 anything.

13 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

14 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible) driveway (inaudible).

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. So today you went
16 down to get your mail, and your -- your newspaper, I assume,
17 and was he out in the yard?

18 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. Yeah, I'd just come home,
19 and he was out (inaudible).

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh-huh.

21 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible) and so I come in,
22 and, you know, he's yelling all the time. So I come in the
23 apartment, and I thought, well, I'm supposed to keep quiet
24 (inaudible) the driveway. The lawyer says I either
25 (inaudible) --

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Right. Right.

2 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible).

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So when you came back he was
4 out in the yard and wasn't doing anything?

5 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He was (inaudible) at that
6 point.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So when you came back you
8 went down the drive to get your mail or your newspaper --

9 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I took my camera with me to take
10 a picture of what he was doing.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Right. So when you got out
12 here, where was he standing?

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible).

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: In the driveway here?

15 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

17 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible). Right there.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

19 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible).

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Is that part of the joint
21 property?

22 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Uh.

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: The driveway, basically.

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: From what I understood, this
25 part here all the way down is easement. I -- I think once

1 you're off the side (inaudible) over there.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh-huh.

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible).

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Our lot (inaudible) is right
5 here.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Oh, it's right there?

7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah. This is him piling all
8 this shit up here.

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Sure. Of course. Of
10 course.

11 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Laughing). But no I seen him.
12 I didn't get off this driveway. I was just walking down it
13 and I was gonna take some pictures of that little speed
14 bump --

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh-huh.

16 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: -- and he comes out at that
17 time, kinda met me right there with the gun.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh-huh. Did he point it
19 you?

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Well, as -- as I was getting
21 to -- came out to take the picture, he put it right back
22 down.

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So he was bringing it up

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He was bringing it up.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. What were the words

1 exchanged at that point when -- when this happened?

2 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Just swearing.

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Swearing?

4 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah (inaudible). Actually,
5 this has been going on for a while. The rest of it, I don't
6 know if you get into all that, but he -- I drove through here
7 about two weeks ago, he came -- my mother was out here doing
8 something here, he comes right up to her, says, "I'm gonna
9 shoot that son of a bitch son of yours."

10 And she was just -- "what?"

11 You know, she's in her 70s. She had no clue what a nut
12 this guy is.

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So, I mean, when you're out
14 and in your property, he literally comes to the edge of his
15 property --

16 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. He'll come right up to
17 here and (inaudible). And -- and so my mother and I called
18 the cops that day (inaudible). Well, a few weeks before that
19 day, he was threatening again before that and (inaudible).

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: How long would you say this
21 has been ongoing?

22 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: The gun part?

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, the threats and the
24 gun.

25 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Well, threats has been on go for

1 a couple years.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: A couple years?

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. (Inaudible).

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: A couple months he's been
5 threatening? And did you say anything threatening to him as
6 you were walking down the driveway, or what --

7 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible).

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So just so I have -- just so
9 I have the right picture, you came home?

10 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Uh-huh.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You grab your camera to go
12 down and get your newspaper?

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: To take pictures of the work
15 she was doing?

16 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yep. Yep.

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And he came back from the
18 house with the shotgun?

19 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yep.

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And met you at the driveway?

21 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Met me right there (inaudible).

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

23 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I don't think he likes me taking
24 pictures.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Well, I tell you what I

1 think should happen, and I don't know what my partner thinks
2 about this: I don't have a problem taking him to jail.

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh (inaudible).

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I don't know what --

5 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He come up here, when he
6 addressed my mother, he went over there to the house and told
7 Keith that, "enough of this threats."

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh-huh.

9 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: And I think probably Keith
10 denied that he was threatening us at that time because they
11 just left then.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Sure. Okay.

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: But this is the first time he's
14 actually brought the damn thing out.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, I don't -- that's
16 pushing it.

17 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: All right. I will be back
19 in a second.

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Great. You bet. And this is
21 what he was (inaudible) you were looking at. (Inaudible).

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

23 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible).

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. And would you say
25 that you guys are supposed to agree on any work that's

1 supposed to be done on this?

2 ~~MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP:~~ That's what the lawyer said, I'm
3 supposed to have 30-day notice on building these things.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

5 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: To agree or not to agree.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

7 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: But he just blows all that off.

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: All right. So he was right
9 here?

10 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible).

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: He was about right down --

12 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah, I ran it over that way.

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So he was right here?

14 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. Good enough.

16 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Are you familiar with Meyers
17 (inaudible). Okay. You know that there's a house
18 (inaudible). Apparently there's been bad blood between this
19 guy and Keith. I think there was a call here -- was there a
20 call here earlier today?

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I don't know about that
22 (inaudible).

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible). In fact, the
24 neighbor (inaudible).

25 (Very long conversation here, but it's completely

1 inaudible to the transcriber.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: What's your name, sir?

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: John Fahl, F-A-H-L.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And what's your middle name,
5 sir?

6 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Raymond.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And your date of birth, sir?

8 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 2/4/60.

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And your social?

10 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 323-54-7868.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: 68? And this is -- what's
12 the address here.

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 1010 North Marquette.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And phone number where
15 (inaudible).

16 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 563-209-1803.

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And your occupation, sir?

18 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Rental manager.

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You own rental property?

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Right. Right, sir. Slum Lord.

21 (Laughing.)

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I'm gonna need the picture.

23 Even if you can -- if I can take the disk or whatever.

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I don't know what you have

1 on the disk --

2 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I took a picture before I had a
3 disk in it, so it's just on the camera. Yeah.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

5 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: But I know I can -- what I've
6 been doing --

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you have the ability to
8 download it to your e-mail and e-mail it to me?

9 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh, yeah. Yeah. That's no
10 problem.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

12 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: And what I've been doing with
13 some of them, I CVS -- I think probably Aldi's, but CVS
14 Pharmacy, you can e-mail to them and then in 24 hours I'll
15 get the prints.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Oh, really?

17 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Really? That works. Any --
19 any hard copy we can get of it, we're gonna need.

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Well --

21 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So just so I understand
22 everything correctly, you came home?

23 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I came home.

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- you were coming up, you
25 saw him doing the work on the driveway?

1 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: He was cussing at you the
3 whole way up.

4 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You didn't say anything to
6 him?

7 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: No. I was in my truck.

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

9 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He talks so loud I can hear
10 through my windows.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. So you go in your
12 house to get a camera to take a picture?

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Picture of what he's doing.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Of the stuff he's doing and
15 to get your newspaper?

16 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yep.

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And by that time, he had
18 gone in the house and come back out with a shotgun?

19 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Right.

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Where did he come from with
21 the shotgun?

22 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He come from the back door.

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: From the back door?

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Like the porch over there,

1 you mean?

2 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. Like the -- by that
3 pickup truck.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

5 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Back in there.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. Then he walked up to
7 that stop sign there?

8 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He walked up to --

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And.

10 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Right.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And started to point the gun
12 at you and you got the camera out?

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah, and he put it down right
14 away.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. And what were his
16 words to you?

17 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Just -- Well, besides the cuss
18 words, what else? Just, "I got my shotgun. I got my
19 shotgun, and I'm gonna use it," or something like that.

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

21 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: And I -- (inaudible) we've
22 reached a new one.

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, I mean, were you --
24 did you feel (inaudible).

25 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I sure did. I was (inaudible)

1 especially after he -- my mother was -- he confronted my
2 mother two weeks ago, then I remembered who it was
3 (inaudible) and they were over here when he threatened me
4 probably six weeks ago, and they -- so I got plenty of
5 witnesses.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: What's the last name?

7 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Of those guys?

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah.

9 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Tedford.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Tedford, T-E-D-F-O-R-D?

11 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Right. Duane and Alecia.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And that was about a week or
13 two ago, you said.

14 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh, them guys, they were
15 probably (inaudible).

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Four or five weeks ago?

17 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So the verbal threats to
19 shoot you have been going on for a couple --

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Month-and-a-half.

21 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Month-and-a-half?

22 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So, I mean, based on the
24 verbal threats, that was enough for you to obviously --

25 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I did.

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- be concerned when you
2 came out?

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Because I'm a little worried,
4 because, I mean (inaudible). So nobody really knows if I'm
5 in trouble up here.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Sure. Sure.

7 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I don't have one of those things
8 you fall down and you push it.

9 (Laughing.)

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I've fallen and I can't get
11 up?

12 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. I -- I just -- I didn't
13 dream it would come to this. I thought it --

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Well, I'm not there yet.
15 I'm there. I don't know if he's there yet.

16 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh.

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: But I -- but based on the
18 fact that you came up the driveway, he met you at the rumble
19 strip he's trying to build.

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

21 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And -- and cussing a string
22 of profanities at you, you come up here minding your own
23 business --

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yep.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- you come back down and

1 he's already back with the gun --

2 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: With the gun.

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- saying that you had
4 threatened him and he was scared, so based on that, I don't
5 feel comfortable saying that that's okay behavior.

6 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh, okay.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: If I'm scared of you and I'm
8 threatened by you, I'm not gonna come back out of my house.

9 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: You -- that's true.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- and I'm not gonna go get
11 a gun and come out and confront you in the driveway that I
12 share with you.

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. Yep.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. I'm gonna go talk to
15 him, and I'll -- I'll (inaudible).

16 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I'm just afraid I'm gonna end up
17 dead, and I'm gonna be (inaudible) gonna find me.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Hopefully, we can get this
19 resolved one way or another. Bear with me.

20 (Inaudible) two other policemen.

21 (Inaudible conversation.)

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: His story hasn't changed.

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible) because, I mean,
25 the guy's story is it's an ongoing thing (inaudible).

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Right. Right. I mean, so
3 today he says all I did was I drove up the driveway, never
4 rolled my windows down, he cussed at me because I drove over
5 the speed bump he's putting on our mutual property nobody's
6 (inaudible) or asked for. He said I went to get the camera
7 to take a picture of that (inaudible) get the newspaper. He
8 come out, he said, "I got my shotgun now," and started
9 pointing it at him, and started to bring it up to take a
10 picture and -- and Keith dropped the shotgun to his side and
11 (inaudible).

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Here's -- here's -- (inaudible).

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 349-0106.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

15 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 06.

16 (Car door slamming.)

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Is that better?

18 MR. MEYER: Can you let my dogs out of the car?

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you want your dog out?

20 MR. MEYER: Just let -- Just open the car door.

21 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah --

22 MR. MEYER: And they can get out.

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: They can get out.

24 MR. MEYER: They'll stay home. Thank you.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, the dogs won't give me

1 any problem. Yeah, no problem.

2 Come on, guys. Come on. It's all right. Come on.

3 Come on, guys. Come on. It's okay. Good dog. Good dog.

4 Come on, buddy. Come on, big bear. Come on. Come on out.

5 Come on.

6 MR. MEYER: They're okay; just leave them there.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Come on. Come on. Come on,

8 buddy. Come on. Come on. Come on. Come on. Come on.

9 Attaboy. Good dog. Good boy. Good dogs. There ya go.

10 Good boys. Good boys.

11 MR. MEYER: You guys stay. Stay.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I smell good.

13 (Inaudible conversation.)

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you have any thoughts on

15 (inaudible) if not (inaudible) charge (inaudible). The --

16 the neighbor has pictures of Keith holding a shotgun

17 (inaudible), and he admits to going in and getting the

18 shotgun (inaudible) and (inaudible). But any way that's

19 pretty much (inaudible) I think we can (inaudible).

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah, I'd (inaudible).

21 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Well, okay (inaudible). I

22 would feel a little better if (inaudible). Yeah.

23 (Inaudible) all right. (Inaudible). Okay. Thanks

24 (inaudible).

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Right, and then (inaudible).

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And I told (inaudible). But
2 anyhow (inaudible).

3 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: What -- what do you want to do
4 (inaudible).

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Well, I wanted to see if you
6 were okay with me (inaudible).

7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER (inaudible).

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible). I'll let him
9 know. I just didn't know if you wanted --

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You might want to check and see
11 if there's any way (inaudible).

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Keith, do you want your dogs
13 secured in the house?

14 MR. MEYER: Huh?

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you want your dogs
16 secured in your house?

17 MR. MEYER: No. I want to --

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you want them left out?

19 MR. MEYER: I mean, are you guys gonna arrest me?

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: We're gonna have to arrest
21 you today, Keith.

22 MR. MEYER: Yeah, I just want my dogs to stay here, I'll
23 call my son, have him come and get them.

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. You don't want your
25 house secured or anything?

1 MR. MEYER: What?

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you want your door closed
3 at all?

4 MR. MEYER: My what?

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Your front door?

6 MR. MEYER: Is it open?

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, it's open. You left
8 it open.

9 MR. MEYER: Yeah. I'll -- yeah. I -- um. Can I get
10 out of the car?

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Can I have permission to get
12 the shotgun?

13 MR. MEYER: What?

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Can I have your permission
15 to get the shotgun?

16 MR. MEYER: Can you have what?

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Can I have your permission
18 to get the shotgun for safety --

19 MR. MEYER: It's in the car. I'll get it for you.

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: It's in the car that the
21 dogs were in?

22 MR. MEYER: Yeah, but I'll have to open the trunk. I
23 already broke it down, there's no -- there's no shells in it.

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Do you understand what happened

1 here, Keith? Do you understand what's happening?

2 MR. MEYER: What?

3 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Do you understand what's
4 happening?

5 MR. MEYER: I -- no. I didn't point a gun at anyone.

6 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm not saying that you did. I'm
7 not (inaudible).

8 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible) someone throw me down, he put a
9 gun to my head, how someone can throw me down all the time, I
10 can stand on my own property, you know, doesn't (inaudible).
11 Why you're arresting me? I don't understand that.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Well, sir, we don't want anybody
13 getting hurt.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You said you broke it down
15 before we got it.

16 MR. MEYER: There weren't ever -- there weren't ever any
17 shells.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Sure, I understand. We're
19 just trying to take it for safekeeping at this point, okay?
20 He didn't hear me.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Do you understand what he said?
22 He's just taking it for safekeeping, you'll get it back.

23 MR. MEYER: All right.

24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You'll get it back.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Should it ask if there's any

1 more guns?

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible) Keith?

3 MR. MEYER: Josh, come on. (Whistling). Come on. Come
4 on, you guys. Come on.

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Come on, guys.

6 MR. MEYER: Come on. It's okay. Come on. Go on in
7 (whistling). She doesn't trust you guys.

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: She loves me.

9 MR. MEYER: She doesn't either.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: She licked me.

11 (Whistling.)

12 MR. MEYER: Come on. Come on.

13 (Laughing.)

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: How old is this one?

15 MR. MEYER: 16.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, I was gonna say,
17 she --

18 MR. MEYER: She's okay, she won't go anywhere, she'll
19 stay there.

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: She's been around a long
21 time. Huh, baby?

22 (Banging noises.)

23 (Inaudible conversation.)

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Keith. Keith.

25 Thanks, Jeff. Bye.

1 (Doors slamming.)

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Apparently he said
3 (inaudible).

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Just so you know.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Hey, let me know as soon as
8 you can what you're gonna charge him with so I can get an
9 e-mail sent out to all the important people and --

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. All right. We'll get
11 'er done.

12 All right.

13 (Dispatch noise.)

14 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Can I help you?

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Davenport with a man.

16 (Dispatch noise.)

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Keith, you make all that
18 wine? Do you make all that wine? That's a lot of wine. Go
19 ahead and have a seat right there. Thank you.

20 I can't even answer a phone (inaudible).

21 (Inaudible conversation.)

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I just want to get his
23 overall dress, what he's wearing now because a guy took a
24 picture of him (inaudible) just to make sure, verify
25 (inaudible).

1 (Inaudible conversation.)

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

3 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: What did he have to say?

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I just told him (inaudible).

5 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Hey, I just arrested Keith
7 Meyer. He -- here's the story: He's got -- (inaudible)
8 today the neighbor came home and Meyers was building a speed
9 bump in the drive way, and the neighbor goes to get his
10 camera to go get the newspaper and take picture of the speed
11 bump because Keith was doing things he wasn't supposed to be
12 ~~doing without the neighbor's consent.~~ As he was driving up
13 ~~the driveway,~~ Keith was cussing at him, screaming at him
14 (inaudible). Parks his car, comes back down the driveway,
15 Keith had come in the house, comes back out with a shotgun,
16 points it at him, right there -- right there in the middle of
17 the driveway. My question to you is what's my best charge
18 for that? He said he pointed it at him, and as he went to
19 take a picture of him, Keith dropped the shotgun down to his
20 side (inaudible) and he took a picture of him holding his
21 shotgun. Yeah, so -- okay. All right. And we got the -- we
22 found the shotgun (inaudible). I said, "Well, I'm going to
23 arrest him, because there's way too much shit going on here."
24 He goes, "Well, I'm on my own property, I can do what I
25 want."

1 I go, "no, you can't." So -- all right. Say assault
2 with a weapon? Nothing else? No -- No. Anything else?
3 Just Assault? Okay, we'll just go with Assault with a Weapon
4 then. All right, thank you, buddy. Sorry about calling you.
5 All right, bye-bye.

6 Assault With a Weapon.

7 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh, displaying a dangerous
9 weapon with a (inaudible).

10 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: 2,000 (inaudible).

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Hey, buddy. Yeah. Okay
12 (inaudible). All right, man. Okay, we'll just stick him
13 with what we've got Assault with a Weapon (inaudible), then
14 we'll just change it. All right, I'll (inaudible). All
15 right, buddy. I called Will, trying to make sure
16 (inaudible). I tried to call Kelly, but she's probably at
17 church.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So you want me to collect
19 what?

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: The neighbor -- here's the
21 story: This has been ongoing for over a month-and-a-half,
22 making threats with a gun. Apparently now Keith's been
23 sending out e-mails to his (inaudible) saying he's got a
24 right to defend himself on his property with a shotgun if he
25 wants to.

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Oh.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So that furthers our case,
3 so -- but there's been an ongoing issue between him and the
4 neighbor and stuff out on the driveway. This guy's coming
5 home today, Keith's out there building a speed bump right in
6 front of the guy's house on the driveway, and he didn't do
7 (inaudible) and Keith just starts waving at him, pointing at
8 him, blah, blah, blah. Goes in, gets his camera, is coming
9 back out to go down and get his -- to get his Sunday
10 newspaper, and Keith come back from the house and starts to
11 point at him and goes, "Hey, (inaudible)." So he gets a
12 picture of him standing with the shotgun. I'm recording what
13 he's wearing now.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: What kind of a camera? Is
15 it digital?

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible). It's not on --
17 it's not on anything but the camera, but still. He showed me
18 the picture, and --

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Sure. Of course. Of
8 course.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Laughing). But, no, I stayed --
10 I didn't get off this driveway. I was just walking down it,
11 and I was gonna take some pictures of that little speed
12 bump --

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh-huh.

14 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: -- and he comes out at that
15 time, kinda meeting me right there with the gun.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh-huh. Did he point it at
17 you?

18 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Well, as -- as I was getting the
19 camera out to take the picture, he put it right back down.

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So he was bringing it up?

21 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He was bringing it up.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. What were the words
23 exchanged at that point when -- when he did that?

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Just swearing.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Swearing?

1 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. And -- Well, actually,
2 this has been going on for a while, the threats of it. I
3 don't know if you get into all that, but he -- My folks were
4 here about two weeks ago. He came -- My mother was out here
5 doing something in the yard. He comes right up to her, says,
6 "I'm gonna shoot that son-of-a-bitch son of yours."

7 And she was just -- "What?"

8 You know, she's in her 70s; s no clue what a nut this
9 guy is.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So, I mean, when you're out
11 here on your property, he literally comes to the edge of his
12 property --

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. He'll come right up to
14 here and (inaudible). And -- And so my mother and I called
15 the cops that day. Well, a few weeks before that day, he
16 was threatening again before that and (inaudible).

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: How long would you say this
18 has been ongoing?

19 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: The gun part?

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, the threats and the
21 gun.

22 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Well, threats has been going on
23 for a couple years.

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: A couple years?

25 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. The gun is relatively

1 new. A few months.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: A few months he's been
3 threatening? And did you say anything threatening to him as
4 you were walking down the driveway, or what --

5 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: No.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So just so I have -- just so
7 I have the right picture, you came home --

8 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Uh-huh.

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- you grabbed your camera
10 to go down and get your newspaper --

11 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- and take pictures of the
13 work he was doing --

14 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yep. Yep.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- and he came back from the
16 house with the shotgun --

17 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yep.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- and met you at the
19 driveway?

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Met me right there where I was
21 taking the pictures there.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

23 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I don't think he likes me taking
24 pictures.

25 What's gonna happen?

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Well, I tell you what I
2 think should happen, but I don't know what my partner thinks
3 about this: I don't have a problem taking him to jail.

4 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh, boy.

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I don't know what --

6 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Well, the one officer come up
7 here when he threatened my mother. He went over there to the
8 house and told Keith, "That's enough of this threats."

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh-huh.

10 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: And I think probably Keith
11 denied that he was threatening us at that time, because they
12 just left then.

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Sure. Okay.

14 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: But this is the first time he's
15 actually brought the damn thing out.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, I don't -- that's
17 pushing it.

18 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: All right. I will be back
20 in a second.

21 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Thank you, sir.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You bet. And this is what
23 he was building that you were looking at?

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yep.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

1 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible).

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. And would you say
3 that you guys are supposed to agree on any work that's
4 supposed to be done on this?

5 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: That's what the lawyer said, I'm
6 supposed to have 30-day notice whenever he's building these
7 things --

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

9 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: -- to agree or not to agree.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

11 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: -- but he just blows all that
12 off.

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: All right. So he was right
14 here.

15 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: (Inaudible).

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, I ran over that one.

17 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah, (inaudible).

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So he was right here?

19 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. Good enough.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Are you familiar with Meyer's
22 residence? Okay. You know that there's a house just the
23 other side of the residence (inaudible). Apparently there's
24 been bad blood between this guy and Keith. I think there was
25 a call here -- was there a call here earlier today?

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I don't know about that
2 (inaudible).

3 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I think there might have been
4 but this, the (inaudible). In fact, the neighbor
5 (inaudible). Okay, so there's been some controversy over
6 where he was at, (inaudible) the drive --

7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Or just off of the --

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: -- or just off it. And Keith was
9 more or less (inaudible). I don't know if Keith was
10 (inaudible). Anyhow (inaudible).

11 (Very long conversation here, but it's completely
12 inaudible to the transcriber.)

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: What's your name, sir?

14 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: John Fahl, F-A-H-L.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And what's your middle name,
16 sir?

17 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Raymond.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And your date of birth, sir?

19 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 2/4/60.

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And your social?

21 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 323-54-7868.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: 68? And this is -- what's
23 the address here?

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 1010 North Marquette.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And a phone number where

1 (inaudible).

2 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 563-209-1803.

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And your occupation, sir?

4 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Rental manager.

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You own rental property?

6 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Right. Right, sir. Slum Lord.

7 (Laughing.)

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I'm gonna need the picture.

9 Even if you can -- if I can take the disk or whatever.

10 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I don't know what you have
12 on the disk come --

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I took a picture before I had a
14 disk in it, so it's just on the camera. Yeah.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

16 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: But I know I can -- what I've
17 been doing --

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you have the ability to
19 download it to your e-mail and e-mail it to me?

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh, yeah. Yeah. That's no
21 problem.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

23 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: And what I've been doing with
24 some of them, I CVS -- I think probably Aldi's, but CVS
25 Pharmacy, you can e-mail to them, and then in 24 hours I'll

1 get the prints.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Oh, really?

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Really? That works. Any --
5 any hard copy we can get of it, we're gonna need.

6 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Well --

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So just so I understand
8 everything correctly, you came home.

9 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I came home.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- you were coming up; you
11 saw him doing the work on the driveway.

12 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: He was cussing at you the
14 whole way up.

15 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You didn't say anything to
17 him.

18 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: No. I was in my truck.

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He talks so loud I can hear
21 through my windows.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. So you go in your
23 houses to get a camera to take a picture.

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Picture of what he's doing.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Of the stuff he's doing and

1 to get your newspaper.

2 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yep.

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And by that time, he had
4 gone in the house and come back out with a shotgun.

5 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Right.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Where did he come from with
7 the shotgun?

8 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He come from the back door.

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: From the back door.

10 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Like the porch over there,
12 you mean?

13 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. Like by that pickup
14 truck.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

16 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Back in there.

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. Then he walked up to
18 that stop sign there.

19 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: He walked up to --

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And --

21 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Right.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And started to point the gun
23 at you, and you got the camera out.

24 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah, and he put it down right
25 away.

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. And what were his
2 words to you?

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Just -- Well, besides the cuss
4 words, what else? Just, "I got my shotgun. I got my
5 shotgun, and I'm gonna use it," or something like that.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

7 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: And I thought, boy, we've
8 reached a new one.

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, I mean, were you --
10 did you feel threatened by him?

11 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I sure did. Especially after
12 he -- My mother was -- He confronted my mother two weeks ago,
13 then I remembered who it was. Their name was Duane and
14 Alecia Tedford, and they were over here when he threatened me
15 probably six weeks ago, and they -- so I got plenty of
16 witnesses.

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: What's the last name?

18 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Of those guys?

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah.

20 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Tedford.

21 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Tedford, T-E-D-F-O-R-D?

22 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Right. Duane and Alecia.

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And that was about a week or
24 two ago, you said?

25 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh, them guys, they were

1 probably four or five weeks ago.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Four or five weeks ago?

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So the verbal threats to
5 shoot you have been going on for a couple --

6 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Month-and-a-half.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Month-and-a-half?

8 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So, I mean, based on the
10 verbal threats, that was enough for you to, obviously --

11 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I did.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- be concerned when you
13 came out?

14 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. Because I'm a little
15 worried, because, I mean (inaudible). So nobody really knows
16 if I'm in trouble up here.

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Sure. Sure.

18 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I don't have one of those things
19 you fall down and you push it.

20 (Laughing.)

21 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I've fallen and I can't get
22 up?

23 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: That's it, yeah. I tell ya, I
24 just -- I didn't dream it would come to this. I thought
25 it --

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Well, I'm not there yet.
2 I'm there. I don't know if he's there yet.

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh.

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: But I -- But based on the
5 fact that you came up the driveway, he met you at the -- at
6 the rumble strip he's trying to build.

7 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah.

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And -- and cussing a string
9 of profanities at you, you come up here minding your own
10 business --

11 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yep.

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- you come back down and
13 he's already left and come back with the gun --

14 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: With the gun.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- saying that you had
16 threatened him and he was scared. So based on that, I don't
17 feel comfortable saying that that's okay behavior.

18 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Oh, okay.

19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: If I'm scared of you and I'm
20 threatened by you, I'm not gonna come back out of my house --

21 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: You -- that's true.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: -- and I'm not gonna get a
23 gun and come out and confront you in the driveway that I
24 share with you.

25 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: Yeah. Yep.

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. I'm gonna go talk to
2 him, and I'll probably be back.

3 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: I'm just afraid I'm gonna end up
4 dead, and then I'm gonna be (inaudible) not gonna find me.

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Hopefully we can get this
6 resolved one way or another. Bear with me.

7 They just sent two other policemen.

8 (Inaudible conversation.)

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: His story hasn't changed.

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible). Because, I
12 mean, the guy's story is it's an ongoing thing (inaudible).

13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Right. Right. I mean, so
15 today he says all I did was I drove up the driveway, never
16 rolled my windows down, he cussed at me because I drove over
17 the speed bump he's putting on our mutual property nobody's
18 (inaudible) or asked for. He said I went to get the camera
19 to take a picture of that (inaudible) get the newspaper. He
20 come out, he said, "I got my shotgun now," and started
21 pointing it at him, and started to back up to take a picture
22 and -- and Keith dropped the shotgun to his side and
23 (inaudible).

24 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Here's -- here's -- (inaudible).

25 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 349-0106.

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).
2 MAN IN WHITE BALL CAP: 06.
3 (Car door slamming.)
4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Is that better?
5 MR. MEYER: Can you let my dogs out of the car?
6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you want your dog out?
7 MR. MEYER: Just let -- Just open the car door.
8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah --
9 MR. MEYER: And they can get out.
10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: They can get out.
11 MR. MEYER: They'll stay home. Thank you.
12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, the dogs won't give me
13 any problem. Yeah, no problem.
14 Come on, guys. Come on. It's all right, come on. Come
15 on, guys. Come on. It's okay. Good dog. Good dog. Come
16 on, buddy. Come on, big bear. Come on. Come on out. Come
17 on.
18 MR. MEYER: They're okay; just leave them there.
19 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Come on. Come on. Come on,
20 buddy. Come on. Come on. Come on. Come on. Come on.
21 Attaboy. Good dog. Good boy. Good dogs. There ya go.
22 Good boys. Good boys.
23 MR. MEYER: You guys stay. Stay.
24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: I smell good.
25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: He was outside in his property --

1 or on his property, this guy goes up threatening him. Keith
2 then went in and got his shotgun (inaudible).

3 (Inaudible conversation).

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you have any thoughts on
5 what I'm -- if not (inaudible) charge (inaudible). No,
6 the -- the neighbor has pictures of Keith holding a shotgun
7 (inaudible). And he admits to going in and getting the
8 shotgun (inaudible) and (inaudible). But anyhow, that's
9 pretty much it in a nutshell. I think we can (inaudible).

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah, I'd (inaudible).

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Well, okay (inaudible). I
12 would feel a little better if (inaudible). Yeah.

13 (Inaudible). All right. (Inaudible). Okay. Thanks
14 (inaudible).

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Right, and then (inaudible).

16 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: And I told (inaudible). But
17 anyhow (inaudible).

18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: What -- what do you want to do
19 (inaudible).

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Well, I wanted to see if you
21 were okay with me (inaudible).

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible).

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible). I'll let him
24 know. I just didn't know if you wanted --

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You might want to check and see

1 if there's any way he wants his house secured.

2 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Keith, do you want your dogs
3 secured in the house?

4 MR. MEYER: Huh?

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you want your dogs
6 secured in your house?

7 MR. MEYER: No. I want 'em --

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you want them left out?

9 MR. MEYER: I mean, if you guys gonna arrest me.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: We're gonna have to arrest
11 to today, Keith.

12 MR. MEYER: Yeah, I just want my dogs to stay here, I'll
13 call my son, have him come and get them.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay. You don't want your
15 house secured or anything?

16 MR. MEYER: What?

17 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Do you want your door closed
18 at all?

19 MR. MEYER: My what?

20 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Your front door.

21 MR. MEYER: Is it open?

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, it's open. You left
23 it open.

24 MR. MEYER: Yeah. I'll -- Yeah. I -- Um. Can I get
25 out of the car?

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Can I have permission to get
2 the shotgun?

3 MR. MEYER: What?

4 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Can I have your permission
5 to get the shotgun?

6 MR. MEYER: Can you have what?

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Can I get your permission to
8 get the shotgun for safekeeping?

9 MR. MEYER: It's in the car. I'll get it for you.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: It's in the car that the
11 dogs were in?

12 MR. MEYER: Yeah, but I'll have to open the trunk. I
13 already broke it down. There's no -- There's no shells in
14 it.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Okay.

16 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Do you understand what's
17 happening, Keith?

18 MR. MEYER: What?

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Do you understand what's
20 happening?

21 MR. MEYER: I -- No. I didn't point a gun at anyone.

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm not saying that you did. I'm
23 not (inaudible).

24 MR. MEYER: (Inaudible) come over and throw me down, put
25 a gun to my head, he can -- how someone can throw me down all

1 the time, I can stand on my own property, you know, doesn't
2 (inaudible). Why you're arresting me? I don't understand
3 that.

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Well, sir, we don't want anybody
5 getting hurt, Keith.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: You said you broke it down
7 before we got it? Okay.

8 MR. MEYER: There weren't ever -- There weren't ever any
9 shells.

10 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Sure, I understand. We're
11 just trying to take it for safekeeping at this point, okay?
12 He didn't hear me.

13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Do you understand what he said?
14 He's just taking it for safekeeping; you'll get it back.
15 You'll get it back.

16 MR. MEYER: All right.

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You'll get it back.

18 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Should we ask if there's any
19 more guns?

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You got any more in the house,
21 Keith?

22 MR. MEYER: Josh, come on. (Whistling). Come on. Come
23 on, you guys. Come on. (Whistling).

24 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Come on, guys.

25 MR. MEYER: Come on. It's okay. (Whistling). Come on.

1 Go on in. (Whistling).

2 She doesn't trust you guys.

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: She loves me.

4 MR. MEYER: She doesn't either.

5 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: She licked me.

6 (Whistling.)

7 MR. MEYER: Come on. Come on.

8 (Laughing.)

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: How old is this one?

10 MR. MEYER: 16.

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Yeah, I was gonna say,

12 she --

13 MR. MEYER: She's okay. She won't go anywhere. She'll

14 stay there.

22 (Doors slamming.)

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


