He said he pointed it at him, and as he went to take a picture of him, Keith dropped the shotgun down to his side (inaudible) and he took a picture of him holding his shotgun. Yeah, so -- okay. All right. And we got the -- we found the shotgun (inaudible). I said, "Well, I'm going to arrest him, because there's way too much shit going on here." He goes, "Well, I'm on my own property, I can do what I

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want."

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I go, "no, you can't." So -- all right. Say assault with a weapon? Nothing else? No -- No. Anything else?

Just Assault? Okay, we'll just go with Assault with a Weapon then. All right, thank you, buddy. Sorry about calling you.

All right, bye-bye.

Assault With a Weapon.

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: (Inaudible).

UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Uh, displaying a dangerous weapon with a (inaudible).

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE OFFICER: 2,000 (inaudible).

UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: Hey, buddy. Yeah. Okay (inaudible). All right, man. Okay, we'll just stick him with what we've got Assault with a Weapon (inaudible), then we'll just change it. UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: So that furthers our case, so -- but there's been an ongoing issue between him and the neighbor and stuff out on the driveway. This guy's coming home today, Keith's out there building a speed bump right in front of the guy's house on the driveway, and he didn't do (inaudible) and Keith just starts waving at him, pointing at him, blah, blah, blah. Goes in, gets his camera, is coming back out to go down and get his -- to get his Sunday newspaper, and Keith come back from the house and starts to point at him and goes, "Hey, (inaudible)." So he gets a picture of him standing with the shotgun. I'm recording what he's wearing now.

UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: What kind of a camera? Is it digital?

UNIDENTIFIED MALE OFFICER: (Inaudible). It's not on -it's not on anything but the camera, but still. He showed me


